A Note from Board Member, Nancy Benson, on Being a Nonprofit & Supporting Eddy Farm School

Did you know Eddy Farm is a nonprofit? It's true, we are! After Doris' death in 1998, the board of directors was formed and Eddy Farm School for Horse and Rider became a non-profit corporation as an educational institution to continue the legacy of Doris Eddy, dedicated to teaching excellence in horsemanship and supporting a mutually beneficial relationship between horse and rider. As a nonprofit organization, all the money that the farm makes goes directly back into the farm; for care of the horses, maintenance, repairs, and upgrades.

Caring for thirty-four horses (17 farm horses and 17 boarders) is no small feat and every year presents challenges and triumphs. So, what does it take to care for these four-legged magical beings? A village of people who care and want to be a part of a community like Eddy Farm, where everyone is welcomed and included. The farm's volunteer board of directors is a hands-on board, all of whom are riders at the farm and care deeply about the farm and its future. The farm's first priority is always the health, safety and well being of the horses who give so much to the people that love them. The farm relies on volunteers to help with many things, from daily chores, to work days and helping with events. The farm is always looking for people with special skill sets (i.e.: fundraising, marketing, building) to volunteer their expertise. Consistent farm management has been vital to the farm and Eddy Farm has been fortunate to have Margaret caring for the horses and farm everyday for the last ten years. Finally, and of course, it takes money to keep this farm moving forward. The farm is committed to engaging in more fundraising efforts. The farm is always grateful for donations. There seems to be an endless list of projects to do requiring money (you will find our wish list further in this newsletter).

Eddy Farm is such a special place, it is difficult to convey in words as it is an experience. It is unique in its character and philosophy of the horse. As many of you know, on a farm there is always a project waiting and needing to be done. Prioritizing is of the utmost importance, and often emergencies arise that push the unnecessary comfort items aside. Every year we do our best to accomplish one or two upgrades to the buildings and infrastructure. We are proud of our accomplishments and how far we have come. Each year we rely a little less on that trusty baling twine to hold things together. That being said, there are items that seem far out of reach and sometimes even a bit frivolous. But, it never hurts to dream right?

So, in no particular order, here is our wish list:

Outdoor sand arena Improved outdoor lighting Heated Tack Room(s) Arena grain room renovation Farm truck and larger trailer Larger tractor Field roller/compactor Shavings shed Field compactor roller Solar panels on barn roofs New cross country jumps Insulation in the indoor arena Shop renovation/total replacement

Upgrade and replace water lines

Upgrade and replace electrical

Repair and replace upper stable doors Install mirrors in the arena

Repair arena roof leaks

Upgrade and renovate farmhouse bathroom Repair and replace lower stable hayloft doors and sill

Renovations and repairs to the arena stalls

Replace arena walkway door

Demolition and removal of shed in Creek Pasture

Run in shed for Caprilli Field and Broodmare Bin

Total overhaul of multiple fence lines and several new gates

Pasture management steps: i.e. implementing rotational grazing, scraping pastures and adding gravel

PVC stadium standards and new jump poles

Farmhouse foundation project: Extensive work needs to be done to the foundation and basement as well as landscaping and grading around the house to drain water away from the house.


